COMPONENTS OF INFORMATION LITERACY




IDENTIFYING OR KNOWING

•The information literate student can identify the nature and extent of information needed.

- defines the need
- knows the available sources
- cost and benefits of getting the information



IDENTIFYING OR KNOWING





IDENTIFYING OR KNOWING

•Questions to ask:

- What do I want to know
- •What kind of information do I need?
- •How much information do I really need?



FINDING OR ACCESSING

•The information literate student accesses needed information effectively and efficiently.

- choose the best methods and systems
- creates effective search strategies
- uses a variety of methods



FINDING OR ACCESSING

•Questions to ask:

- •What is the best way I can get this information?
- •Am I employing the appropriate terms?
- •From which search system and resources can I acquire the information?



EVALUATING OR ASSESSING

•The information literate student evaluates information and its sources critically and incorporates selected information into his or her knowledge base and value system

- legitimate or authoritative sources
- recognize bias, prejudice, and manipulation
- can summarize and extract main ideas
- Comparison of new knowledge to prior knowledge
- Investigate differing viewpoints

EVALUATING OR ASSESSING

How can I tell if this information is useful and trustworthy?

CRAAP Test it!

C urrency

R elevance

A uthority

A ppropriate

P urpose

When was it created?

Is it on my topic?

Is the creator an expert?

Can I comprehend the words?

Why was it created?



EVALUATING OR ASSESSING

•Questions to ask:

- •Is this an authentic and real source of information?
- •How can I interpret the information or in another perspective?
- How can this new information affect what I have learned?



APPLYING OR USING

•The information literate student, individually or as a member of a group, uses information effectively to accomplish a specific purpose

- applies new and prior information
- can reflect upon the research process



APPLYING OR USING

Questions to ask:

- What is the best technique in showing this information?
- Will the message I want get across?
- Are the research materials helpful to my ideas?



IMPLEMENTING ETHICAL INFORMATION

•The information literate student understands many of the economic, legal and social issues surrounding the use of information and accesses and uses information ethically and legally

- ethical, legal and socio-economic issues
- understand and follow laws and regulations



IMPLEMENTING ETHICAL INFORMATION

•Questions to ask:

- Can I duplicate this material?
- What are the aspects in censorship?
- Are these policies about information gathering, reproducing and disseminating information?


